1.	Form your business. \square
	1.1. Review Florida formatting options. \Box
	There are four main business formatting options; review each option carefully and pick
	the one that fits your business best.
	1.2. Name your business. \square
	Search the Division of Corporation's website to check if your chosen name is available
	before registering your business name at dos.myflorida.com.
	1.3. Get an Employer Identification Number. \Box
	Register for your EIN with the IRS.
2.	Register your business in Florida.
	2.1. Register a profit or non-profit corporation. \Box
	File Articles of Corporation on sunbiz.org and pay the \$70.00 registration fee.
	2.2. Register an LLC. □
	File Articles of Organization on sunbiz.org and pay the \$125.00 registration fee.
	2.3. Form a Florida Partnership. \square
	Complete the required forms on sunbiz.org for the type of partnership you want to form
	and pay the required fees.
3.	Obtain the necessary permits and licenses. \Box
	3.1. Determine what licenses and permits are needed for your industry. \Box

	Use the industry pages on www.myfloridalicense.com to find out what business licenses
	you need.
	3.2. Apply for the necessary licenses and permits. \Box
	Access the applications for your business licenses and permits on the industry pages on
	www.myfloridalicense.com.
	3.3. Apply for a Florida county business tax receipt. \Box
	Register with your county tax collector.
	3.4. Determine if you need a local city business tax receipt. \Box
	Check with your city government.
4.	Register your business for taxes.
	4.1. Set up your tax accounts. \square
	Be sure to pay federal, state, county, and municipal taxes.
	4.2. Create a state tax account with the Department of Revenue. \Box
	Go to taxapps.floridarevenue.com/IRegistration/ to create your state tax account.
	4.3. Be sure to pay your county and municipal taxes. \Box
	Contact your county's business office and your city's administration for details on the
	applicable rates and how to pay them.
5.	Hire and register new employees. \square
	5.1. Report new and rehired employees. \square
	Register all newly and rehired employees with the Florida Department of Revenue.
	5.2. Keep up with payroll taxes. \square
	Be sure to pay Federal Income Tax Withholding, Social Security, Medicare, and
	Unemployment Insurance.
	5.3. Apply for Worker's Compensation Insurance. \Box
	Go to the Division of Worker's Compensation website to find all the necessary forms.



5.4.	Display the required posters. \square
	Find downloads for all the required posters and notices on Florida Department of
	Economic Opportunity's website.
